

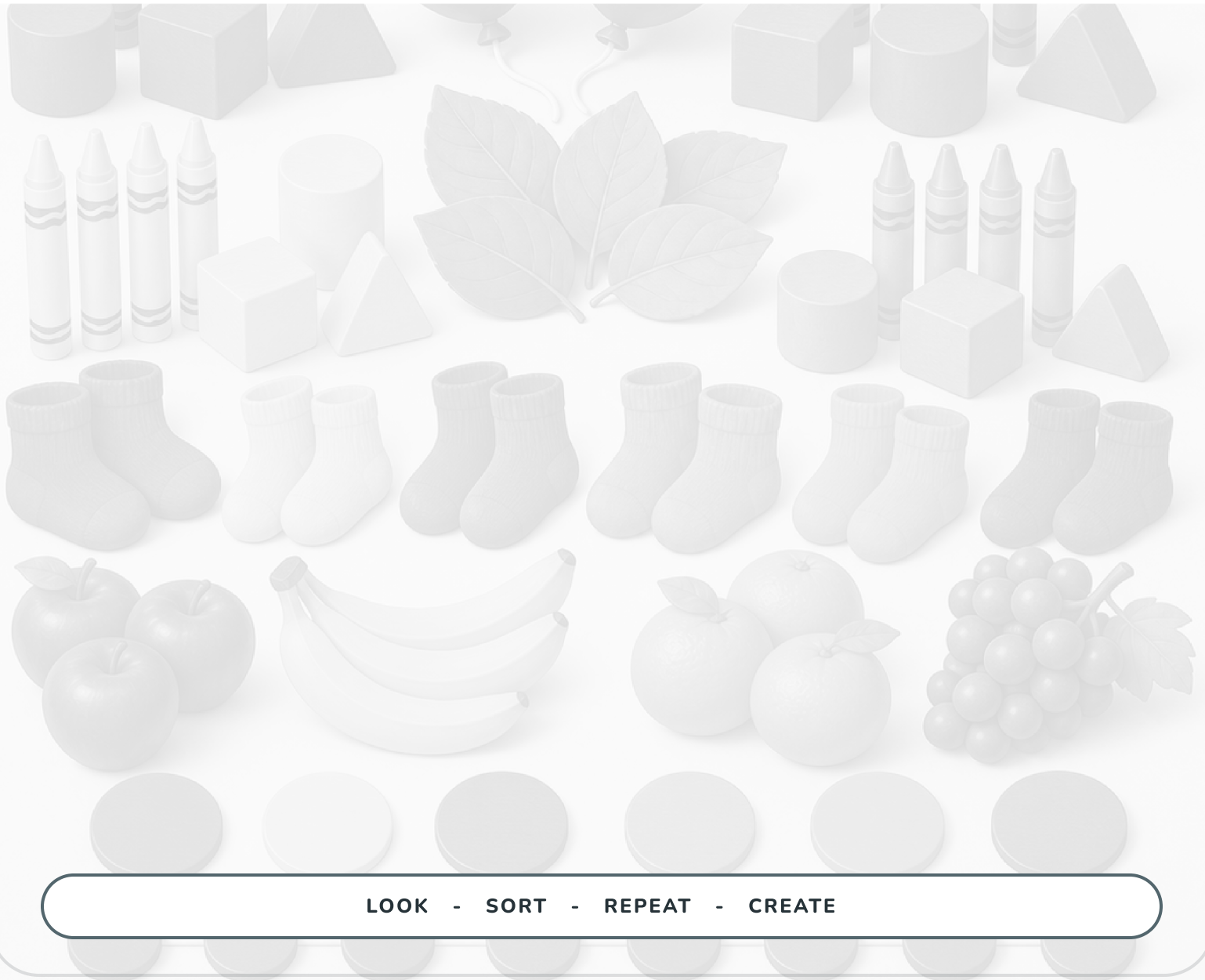

Grown-Up Guide

Short, flexible practice for home, preschool, Pre-K or quiet-time learning.

Quick start

1. Print the pages that fit today's skill.
2. Use crayons, colored pencils or washable markers.
3. Read the short direction aloud, model one example, then let the child try.

Ink Saver tip: Use the printed words and patterns first. Children may add their own colors before sorting.

Choose a level

- 1 Notice**
Name, find and match colors.
- 2 Sort**
Compare and classify by one clear rule.
- 3 Repeat**
Complete AB, AAB and ABB patterns.
- 4 Create**
Explain a rule and make a new group or pattern.

Make it fit

Make it easier

- Offer only two choices.
- Cover extra rows.
- Point and answer aloud.
- Model the first turn.

Add a challenge

- Ask, "How do you know?"
- Find a real object that follows the rule.
- Change the sorting rule.
- Let the child teach the page back.

Helpful routine

Keep one page to about 5-10 minutes. Stop while the activity still feels successful. A correct answer matters less than noticing, comparing and explaining.

No answer key is needed: each task has one visually clear rule, while open pages accept more than one reasonable response.

Safety and supervision

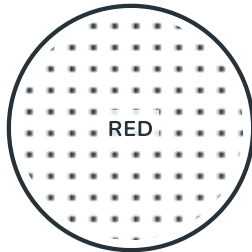
Recommended for ages 3-5 with adult supervision. Use age-appropriate, non-toxic art materials and follow each material manufacturer's instructions. This pack does not require cutting. Keep optional manipulatives and small objects away from children who may put them in their mouths. Stop if any material becomes damaged. This resource offers educational practice and is not a developmental assessment.

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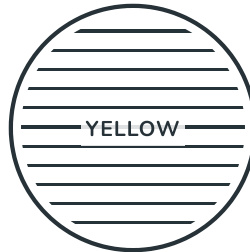
