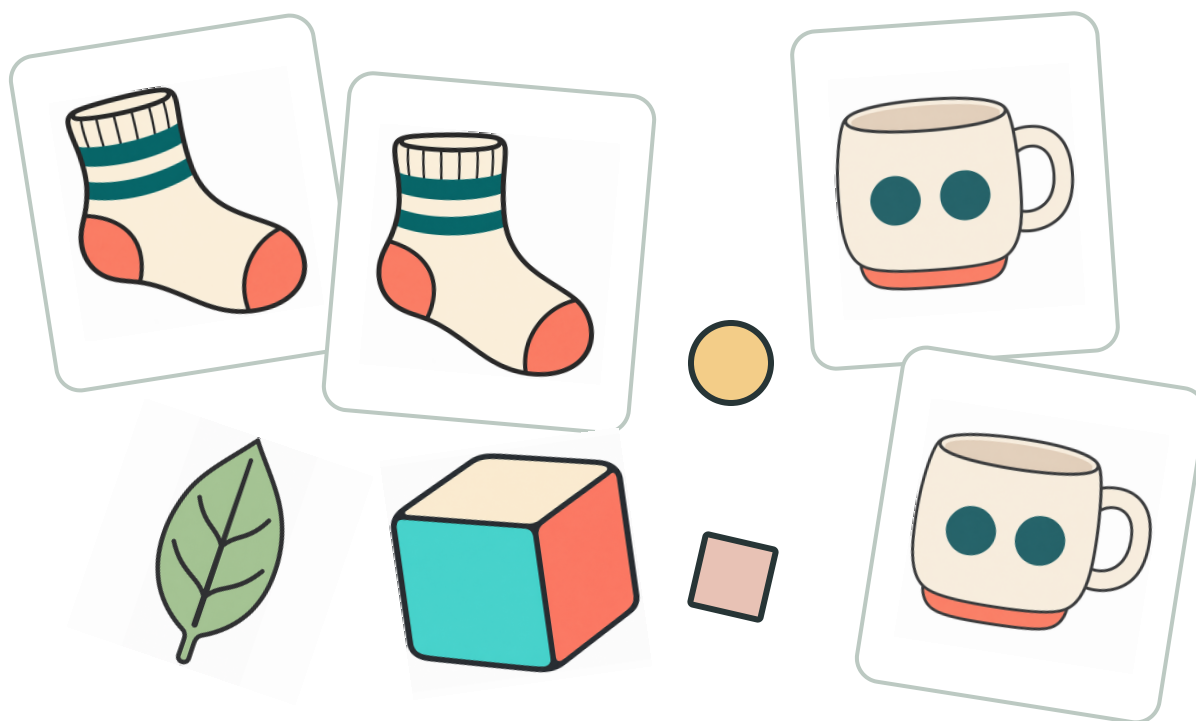

Grown-Up Guide

Choose one page at a time. Read the directions aloud, name unfamiliar objects, and let your child point before using a pencil.

1. START WITH SUCCESS

Begin with Pages 4–7. Look for exact matches, then explore same, different and changing size. Use only 2–3 choices if needed.

2. ADD A LITTLE CHALLENGE

Try Pages 8–11. Notice outlines, direction and small details. Remind your child that the same object may look bigger or smaller.

3. READY TO THINK ABOUT RELATIONSHIPS

Pages 12–16 explore completion, related pairs, mixed challenges and making a match. On Page 12, point to a half and imagine sliding it into the empty space. On Page 13, read each situation aloud and ask why the pair works.

4. IF MATCHING GETS TRICKY

Guessing? Cover extra choices.

Only noticing color? Ask, “What else looks the same?”

Lines are difficult? Allow pointing or placing a large counter.

Too much to look at? Cover all but one row.

Either hand is welcome. Turn the page slightly if that makes line drawing more comfortable. Pause when your child has had enough.

Keep it safe

- Adult supervision is recommended.
- Use child-safe scissors only.
- Keep small cut pieces and counters away from children who may place them in their mouths.
- No scissors? Draw matching lines instead.

Make your own pictures for a grown-up to match.

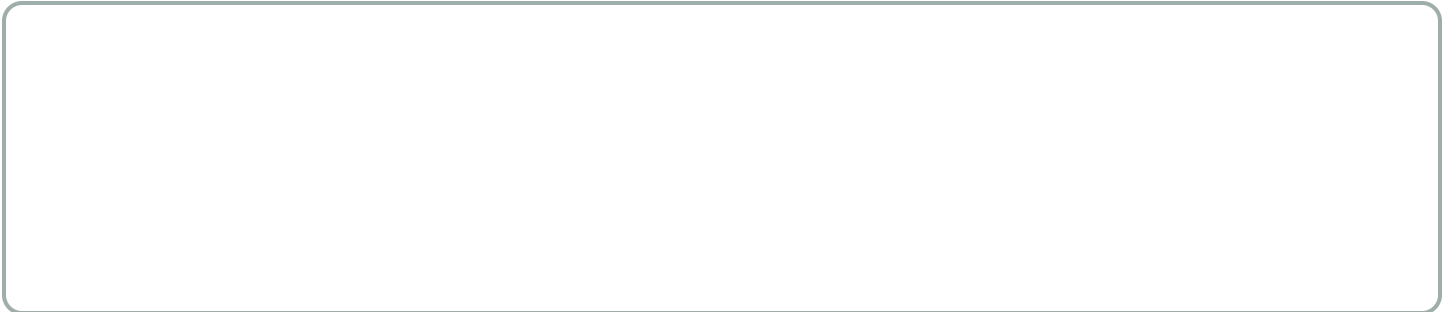
DRAW ONE
