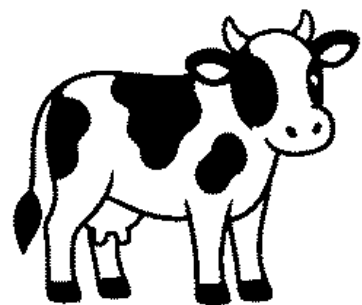
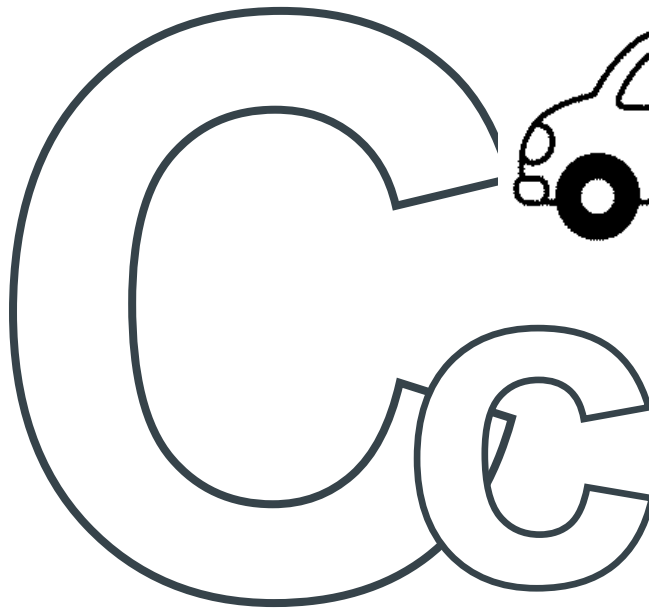
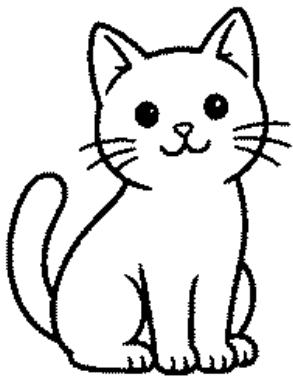

INK SAVER • AGES 3–5

Grown-Up Guide + Safety

A flexible way to use this pack.

Use one page at a time. A few minutes count.

WHO & WHAT

For ages about 3–5. Practice noticing C/c, keeping C open, making its curve, and hearing /k/ in familiar words.

START HERE

Try page 4 first. If C is new, use pages 4–6 before tracing. You can stop after any page.

MAKE IT EASIER

Offer two choices at once. Say picture names aloud. Model one answer, then let your child point or circle.

TIME & TOOLS

Try 5–10 minutes, or less if attention fades. Optional: crayons, pencil, marker, or dot marker. No scissors or glue.

PARTICIPATION COUNTS

Pointing, circling, finger tracing, or saying a word all count. A neat pencil letter is never required.

SIMPLE SAFETY

Use age-appropriate drawing materials and follow product labels. Adult supervision is recommended. Keep caps and small items away from mouths. Pause if tired.

Printing Guide + Copyright

Choose your edition and print at full size.

PRINT

US Letter (8.5 × 11 in). Print at Actual Size / 100%. Turn off Fit to Page. Use portrait orientation.

PICK AN EDITION

Color uses small accents and full-color pictures. Ink Saver uses outline pictures, white space, and dark task marks.

HOME PRINTER NOTE

Try page 5 and page 11 first. If lines look faint, choose a normal-quality print setting. Black-and-white works.

Look at the opening on the right.

C is open. O closes.

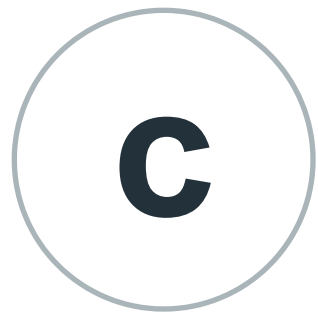
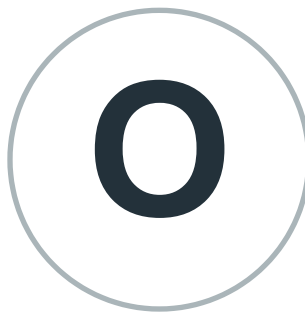

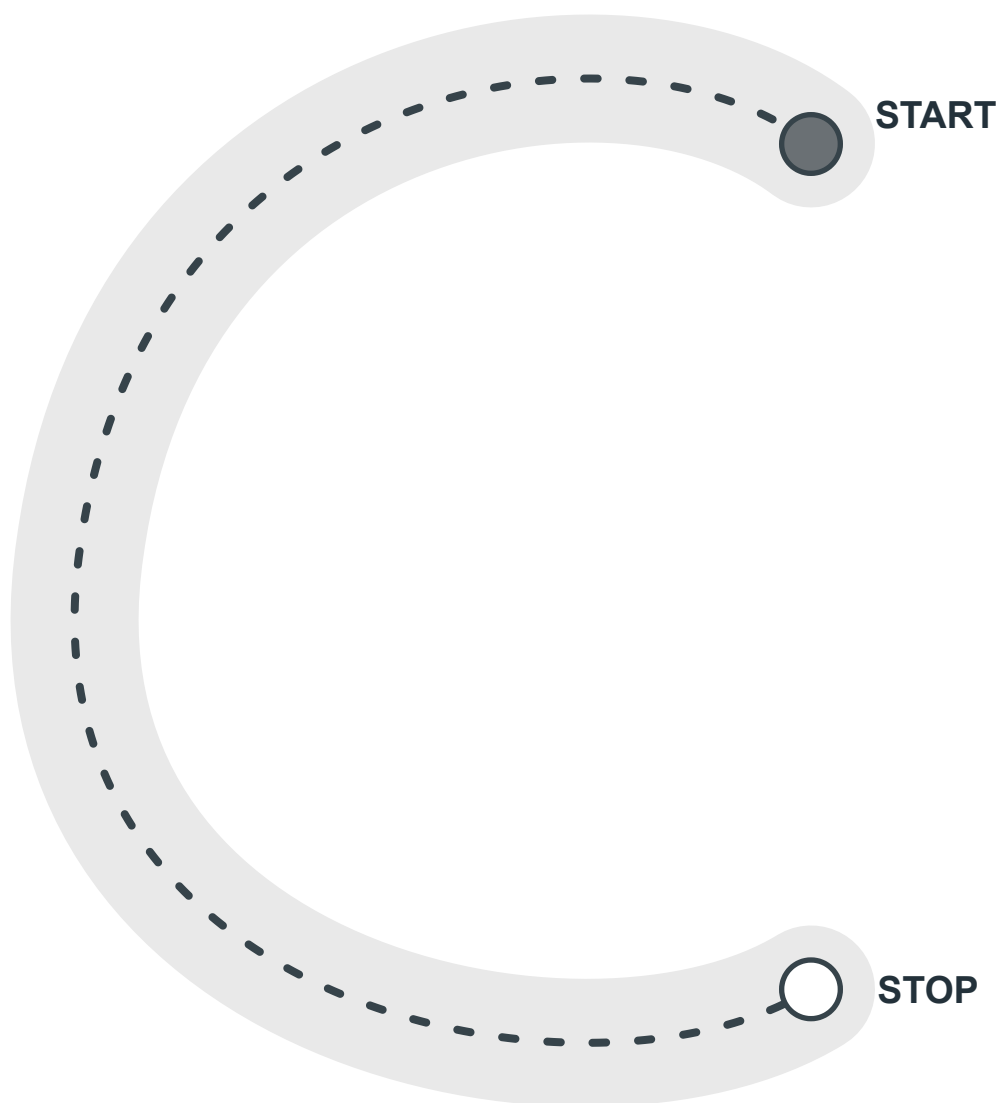

Follow Big C

Finger tracing or crayon tracing both work.

Start at the dot. Follow the curve to STOP.

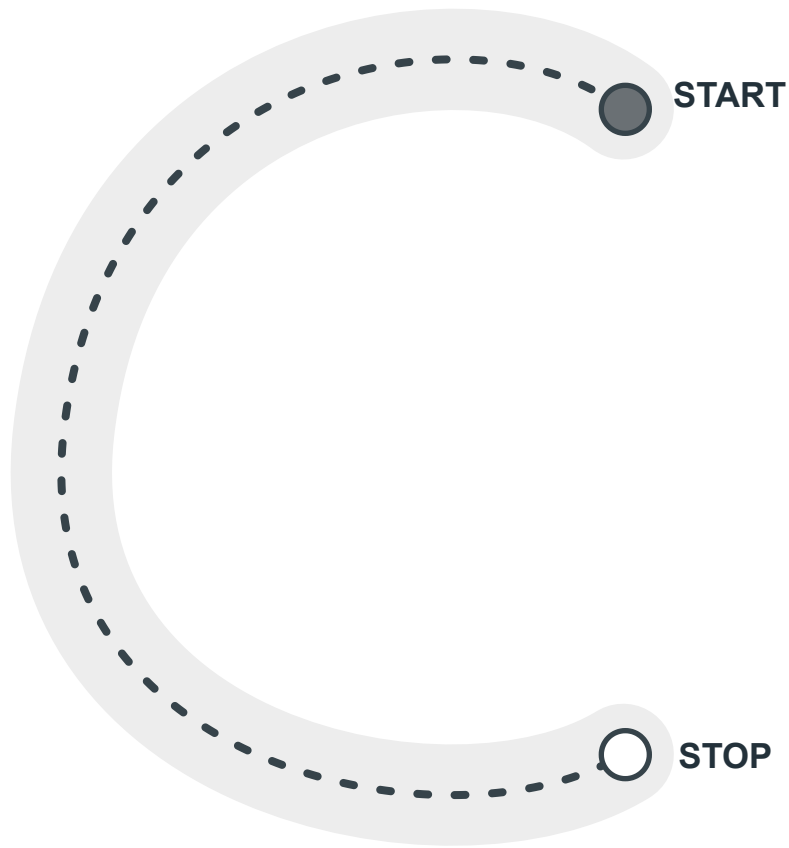


The right side stays open.

Follow Little c

Follow the smaller curve from start to stop.

Little c is smaller. It still stays open.



Say “open” when you reach the gap.

Trace, Then Try Cc

A little less help each time.

Trace the first three. Try one in the last box.

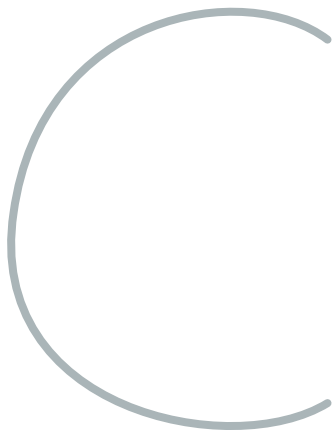
1 Trace big C

Make one open C or c.

Find C in the Letter Crowd

Both BIG C and little c count.

Circle every C and c. Leave the other letters.



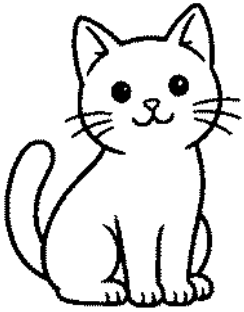
Look for the right-side opening.

Hear the /k/ Sound

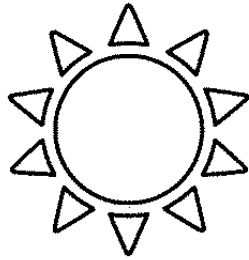
Hear the first sound in a spoken word.

Grown-up: say each picture name.

Child: circle pictures that begin with /k/.



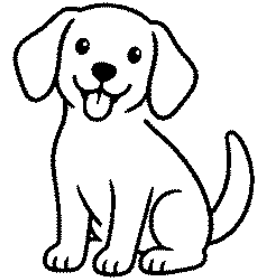

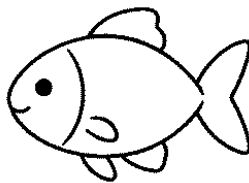

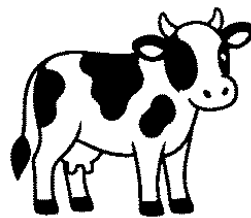

C Word Match

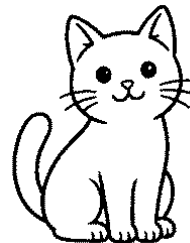
A short matching task; independent reading is optional.

Each word begins with c.

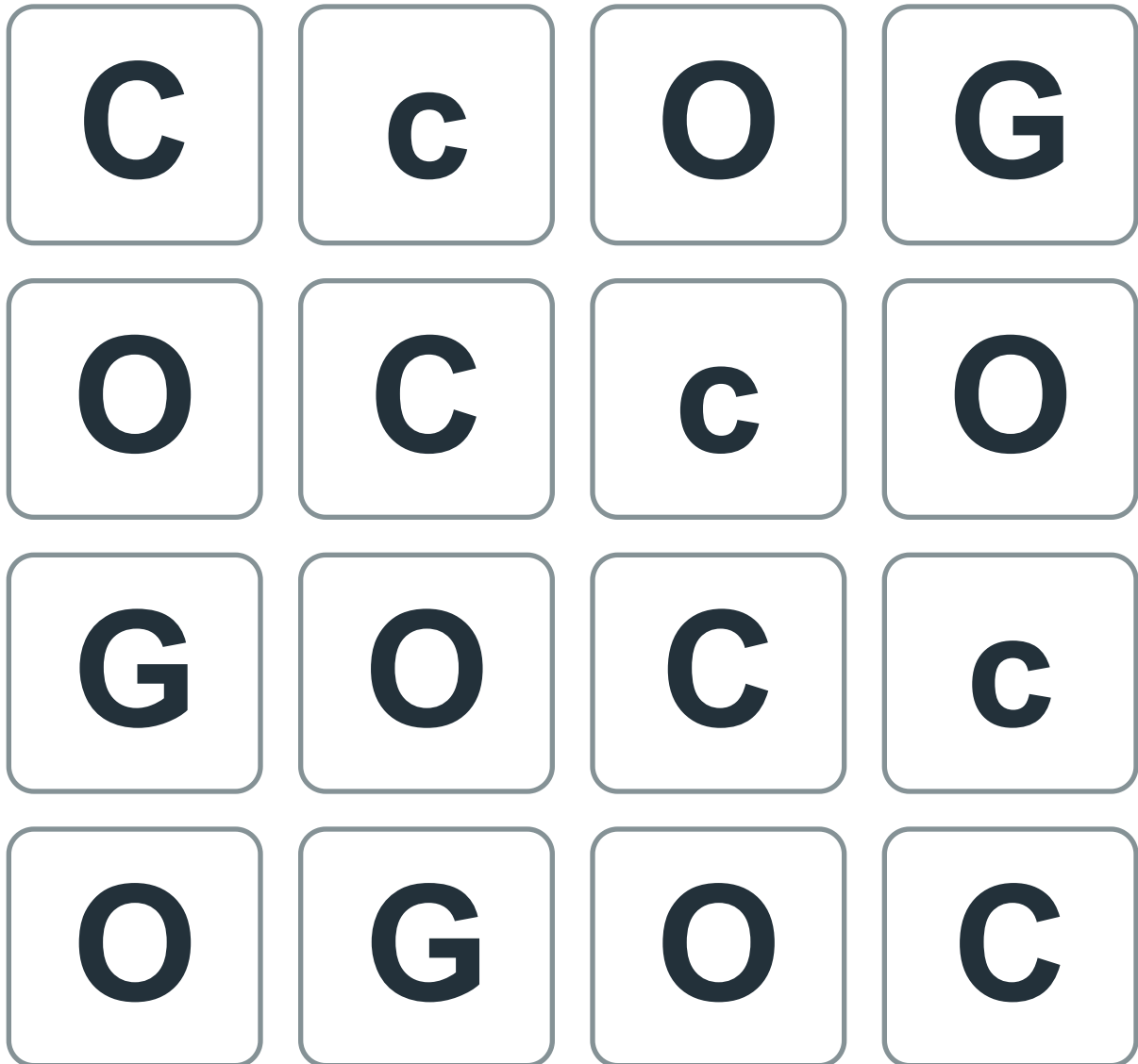
C Trail

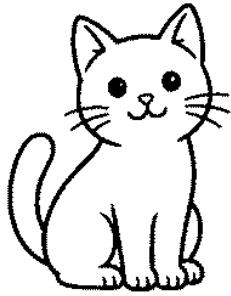

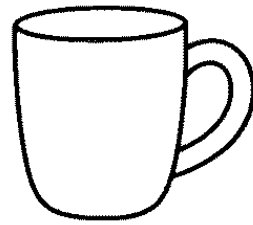
Spot the C at the Start

Circle the first c in each word.



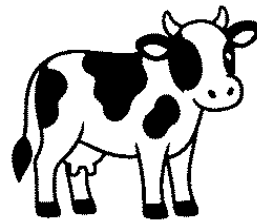

Leave a gap on the right. Any smooth mark is okay.



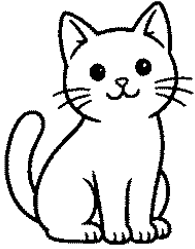
If needed, finger-trace page 7 first.

Choose one C picture or another C word.

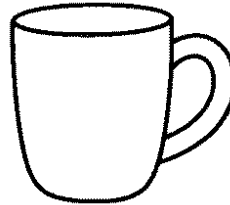
Say it, draw it, then circle or write C/c.



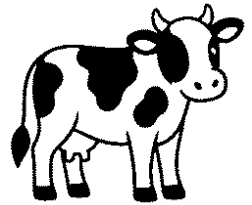
