Print & Adapt

US Letter · Actual Size / 100%.
Use Ink Saver for black-and-white printing.
Angle the page in a comfortable position for either hand. Try just 1–5 on Page 7 first.

- Page 15 should be completed with adult supervision.
- Use child-safe scissors only.
- Printing, trimming, and assembly are adult responsibilities.
- Skip or simplify any activity that feels too difficult for the child.

Cut the big pieces. Glue them onto another sheet.

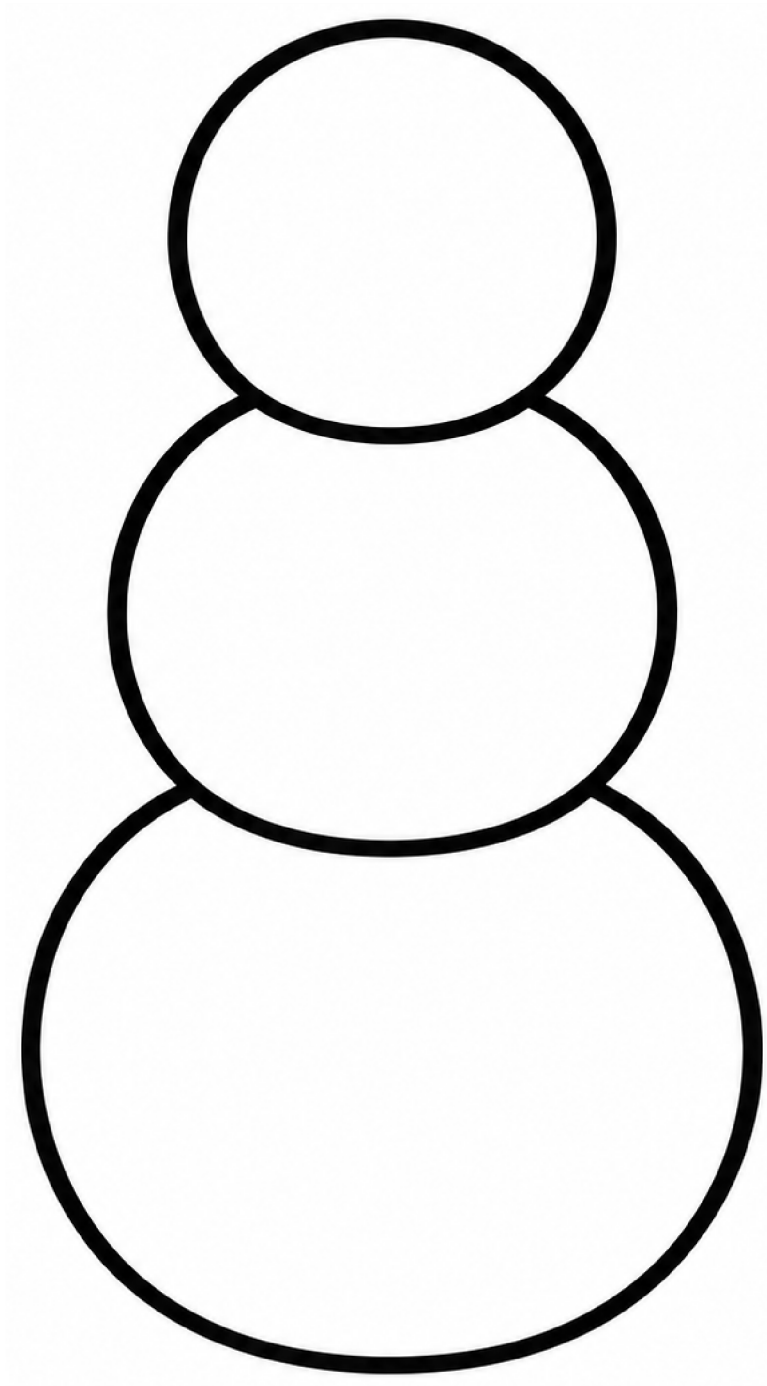
